

At the business meeting held on November 18, 2005, it was decided by vote to help one family in need through the Christmas Cheer Office and, in addition, visit a local nursing home to put on a Christmas program with singing, dancing, and small gifts to those who have no one to share the Holidays. The club members voted to match the funds raised from our annual yard sale giving us a total of \$1400.00 to use in our Christmas Cheer program this year. As discussed in the meeting, we also decided to publish a list of "Wish" items for our members who would like to donate to Christmas Cheer Toys for Tots.

I am extremely excited with the positive response of the membership to these ideas. I have chosen the family. It is a family in which a Grandmother is trying to raise 3 small children, under the age of 6 on her own. Last year she was in an automobile accident and now her immediate need for medication has surpassed her ability to afford a decent Christmas for these small children. This is the first year she has asked for help from Christmas Cheer. She is asking for clothing such as jeans, sweatshirts, underclothes, slippers, knit hats, gloves, shoes. Food items, stuffed animals, trucks, building blocks, color books, crayons, play dough, bath toys, action figures, books, baby dolls, small bike or tricycle which can be used. I believe we can supply many of these items to them if we shop wisely with the money we have.

I have contacted several of our local Nursing home facilities with inquiries as to the suitability of our visiting and all were excited to have the opportunity, however, the only Sunday afternoon available for any of them is Sunday, November 11, 2005 at 3:00 pm.




