Burlington Shag Club Business Meeting—2/19/10

- 1. Steve McHone called the meeting to order at 8:02 PM.
- 2. Joan Kimbro welcomed all members, asking if there were any new members present. Joan recognized Cindy Swiggett as a new member.
- 3. Report of the Secretary:
- •Per Lorna Shively, current membership is 212, with 13 of those being new members since the last meeting. If you have mailed your membership in, see Lorna after the meeting to get your card.
- •Lorna asked for any changes to the minutes from the January business meeting. None given.
- 4. Joan asked that all members make sure to give Lorna their email addresses even if they want the Shag Rag mailed. Since the phone tree isn't working yet, this gives us a way to make notifications about meetings, cancellations, etc. as needed. The phone tree only works on Windows XP or lower and Gail has Windows Vista. It would costs \$110.00 to upgrade. We have emails for all but about 35-36 members.
- 5. Financial Report: Ed Smith presented the YTD report as of 2/19/10. Ending balance after income and expenses is \$5132.93. Sheila Walker made a motion to accept as presented. And Hugh Walker seconded. All approved.
- 6. Joan reported that she and Edith Loy attended the mid-winter workshop. She will have more details after the ACSC Winter Workshop in Mooresville. Joan also announced that Mary Gregory has been tapped as the webmaster for SOS.
- 7. Membership:
- •Scott Ursery stated that the re-up party held on 2/5/10 was a great success. We had approximately 98 members re-up. There was great food and great fun for all. They are currently calling all the 2009 members who have not yet re-upped. Also, we had several people asking about joining the club at the MOW dance. Joan thanked the membership committee for a great job!
- 8. MOW:
- •Steve Stearns reported that the MOW dance was very successful and he really appreciated the support of the club and its members. The total taken in at this point is \$23,924.00, gross. He also received compliments on the decorating and on how well everything was run. Joan stated that the officers working the event were very impressed with the attitudes and actions of all involved.
- 9. SOS Float:
- •Per Fred Hallaman, the next float meeting is tomorrow, 2/20 at 10:00 AM at The Downtown Bistro in Gibsonville. All members are welcome to come out and help or make donations. He asked that the club provide \$700.00 for the float and other costs. Participants will pay a \$25.00 float fee—for walkers and riders. Also, Joan stated that we have reserved the Boulevard Grill for the after party for 5-8 PM, win or lose. We are celebrating our club and the hard work put into the float. Brenda Smith made a motion to allocate the \$700.00 from the club. Evelyn Turner seconded the motion. All approved.
- 10. New Business: Board of Directors
- •Mary stated that the next meeting is scheduled for 2/24/10 at 6:15 PM at The Downtown Bistro in Gibsonville. Mary is the Chairman, Carol the Vice- Chairman and Edith –Secretary.
- •Gail Jordan presented the following proposed changes to the by-laws.
 - Article IV, ORGANIZATION STRUCTURE, under B, item number 5: The current by-laws state that there are 4 required meetings of the Board of Directors which should be held the 1st month of each quarter. Other meetings can be called as necessary. The change would read as: There will be 4 required meetings each year. These meetings will be held once a quarter at the discretion of the board members. Other meetings can be called as needed.
- Article III, MEMBERSHIP, item number D: The current amendment states that if membership dues are not received by February 1st, those members will be removed from the rolls and will incur an additional \$5.00
 - charge after February 1st if they renew. The changes to this amendment would add the following: The club usually does a re-up party in January to encourage members to rejoin. In the event of an act of God such as bad weather that prevents the club from holding the re-up party on its originally set date, dues will not go up until weather permits the re-up event to be held safely. Otherwise, dues renewed after February 1st will incur an additional \$5.00 charge.
 - Jonnie Ellington also presented a proposed by-law change from the HOF Nominating Committee. If you have been selected or volunteered to serve on this committee, you should remove yourself from the committee if you or spouse/relative are nominated. An alternate will replace you on the committee.

These items were held open for discussion. Per Ronnie Gregory, an officer cannot be removed from the committee. He suggested that Joan appoint a committee to review and reword the proposed changes to the by-laws and present all changes in the newsletter. Per Sheila Walker, these changes will need to be presented to the club and approved prior to being posted in the Shag Rag. Once they are printed in the newsletter, they can be presented for a vote at the next business meeting. Sheila made a motion for Joan to form a committee to review these revisions, Ronnie seconded. All approved.

- 11. Shag Lessons: Per David Satterfield, they have been asked to teach the line dance "Swamp Thang". They will begin these lessons on 3/5/10 and 3/12/10 at 8:00 PM.
- 12. Summer Workshop: Evelyn Turner reported that we will be bidding for the 2011 Summer Workshop. Mary Gregory will place this bid for us. We are considering a casino theme if chosen.



Shagger to Alaska....

Each year in January, we hear Charlie Brown of WPCM talk about his wife Sue going to Alaska for a few weeks. Since both Charlie and Sue are members of our shag club, I asked her to write a short article and tell us about her adventures while there.



The first question I am asked when people find out that I go to Alaska in the winter is "why do you go when it so cold?" My answer is "I go for the sled dogs, the Alaskan people, and the beauty of the land". My first trip was in March, 2000 for the start of Iditarod. What an incredible experience! Then in 2002 I went to Nome, Alaska for part of the finish. I was hooked, so beginning in 2004, I started volunteering for the end of the race in Nome. After 5 years with Iditarod, I went for the end of the Yukon Quest International Sled Dog Race in Fairbanks last year and then back there this year for the start of the race. As a volunteer, I helped wrap up details of their Starter Banquet with their sponsors, helped with the Meet the Mushers event, managed their online auction and managed one of their

fundraisers during the week. I also had the opportunity to work the staging area for the start of the race. The picture is of me on the sled with Zack Steer, a musher from Sheep Mountain, Alaska. We were on the Yukon River going to the start line. My friend and I went to Chena Hot Springs one evening to visit the Ice Museum and watch the Northern Lights. Both were incredible! I had an Appletini served in a real ice glass. We went on a horse drawn sleigh ride, visited the Museum of the North and I drank a "tankard of beer" with my new friend Sandy who is a Presbyterian Minister in Fairbanks. We had a high of 5 degrees one day, but most of the time it was minus 10 down to minus 35. There is nothing more beautiful than a team of sled dogs running, and there is nothing more exciting than to be on the back of the sled with those dogs.
