Joan welcomed everyone to our first meeting of 2014

Secretary’s report: Lorna noted that we now have 292 (this is of course with the carryover until re-up). 80 of those are new members since 2012. Re-up party volunteers are needed to help with the sign up tables. The more help we have, the quicker and smoother the process will be. If you can do you re-up tonight, it will help avoid the crush at the re-up party, so see Lorna after the meeting or in the lounge. Chuck Upchurch made a motion to accept the report and Tim Wood seconded, all approved. Also, Lorna reported that we received a thank you letter from Allied Churches for our donation of 35 pounds of food. Joan reminded everyone that the need is ongoing and that we can continue to bring food in.

Treasurer’s Report: Per Amy, our YTD balance as of 12/31/13 was \$9239.09. Amy reviewed the expenses vs. the deposits. Mike Wilson made a motion to accept the report and Jesse Justice seconded, all approved.

Proposed Budget: Amy presented the proposed 2014 budget. Open discussion was held on these projected figures. As noted in the previous year’s budget vs. expenses, we don’t spend close to this amount since we normally raise enough money to cover expenses for the specific events. Also, if we approve these figures now, the chairperson for each event will not have to wait and make a motion for these monies. They will come back to the membership for approval of any additional funds that may be needed above and beyond the approved amounts. Janice McSherry made motion to accept as presented and to also change this from a “proposed” budget to our firm budget for 2014. Mike Wilson seconded, all approved. Amy did suggest that any chairperson come to her or Joan prior to spending out of their allocated funds just so there aren’t any cash flow issues that would interfere with other events/activities.

Sunshine: Per Penny, Cindy Swiggett’s mother passed away on December 6, 2013. Janice McSherry had a defibrillator and a pacemaker implanted at Duke Hospital - 12/19/2013. Betty Caviness spent Christmas day in the Duke Hospital ER. She was very ill and her blood pressure dropped too low. It was determined she had a flu virus. Penny Rice’s son, Mark Keck, is scheduled for surgery on Feb. 5 for kidney cancer. Edith Loy’s sister has been diagnosed with breast cancer. She has an appointment with a surgeon on Jan. 13. Gloria Thompson’s daughter had an emergency c-section on Jan. 10.

Birthdays: Lorna read off the January birthdays.

SOS Cards: Edith stated that she has SOS cards and that you will need one to get into the clubs at Mid-Winter.

MOW ticket sales: Edith has more MOW tickets for sale. They are \$25.00 for the dance only, \$45.00 for the dinner dance, with the dance tickets going up to \$30.00 at the door. She also needs some more volunteers to help work the doors until 10:00 PM.

Christmas Party: Chuck reported that the party turned out wonderfully. He thanked all of those who helped and also Teresa for all she did, even though she was sick and couldn’t attend. The Country Club Lanes provided great food and cleaned up afterwards, saving our membership from having to do this. We had budgeted \$2000.00 for the party, but after all expenses were taken out, we had a profit of \$264.00 from the door receipts. NONE of the \$2000.00 allocated was used.

New Year’s Eve Party: Janice McSherry reported that we had between 200-215 people in attendance and everyone had a great time. We also sold 133 breakfast tickets, for a total of \$665.00 which was given to Robin for her wonderful food. We spent \$298.29 on favors and snacks, and had gotten a great deal on the favors, so have plenty left for next year. Janice also thanked all who helped make this happen.

BOD Meeting: Edith stated that the meeting was held on 1/8/14 at 7:00 at in the birthday room at Country Club lanes. Mike Wilson was elected as the chairperson and Edith Loy was elected Secretary. The board also discussed the 2014 proposed budget and determined any changes needed from 2013’s. **The next meetings are scheduled for 4/16/14, 7/16/14 and 10/15/14.** Members are encouraged to attend if they would like. Mary Gregory has filled out 590N tax form for 2013.

Re-up Party—Per Amber, this is being held on 1/24/14 beginning at 8:00, and inclement weather date will be 1/31/14. Lorna will be here around 7:00 to start the re-up process for those coming early. It will again be a sports theme and Showtime Lounge (Robin and her crew) are donating a BBQ dinner to those who have joined by/during that night. You must have a dinner ticket to eat and you can only get this with a current 2014 membership. The meal time will end at 9:00PM. Chigger Woods will be our DJ.

MOW: Joan reminded everyone that this will be held on 2/15 and that it is a huge event for the club. It is the event that has won us recognition with the Cammy Awards for the last 2 years. As of this date, Ramada has not rented out the rooms on 2/14 and we should be able to decorate that night ahead of time, as in the past. Sponsor letters have been sent out and numerous members have been given a listing to call to see if these companies wish to donate for the silent auction.

Float: Amy stated that she will be holding our first meeting on 1/15/14 at 7:00 in the Birthday room at CCL. This is the 20th year for the parade and we want to continue to put our best foot forward. She will take this first meeting to explain the rules for the themes and judging, as there have been many questions regarding these issues in the past. She is also going to schedule another meeting for 1/25/14 at CCL in the birthday room, if it is available. She will let everyone know ahead of time. This second meeting will be the one where ideas for the song, theme, etc. are pitched and voted on. The parade is earlier than normal this year, so we really need to start moving. With MOW taking up much of our time through 2/15/14, we will need to start as soon as we can. Amy hopes to have the first workshop at her house on 2/1/14. We will not work on 2/15/14 due to the MOW event. The date for the cook out is TBD. She will also be having many sub-committee chairmen, so please work with everyone as needed.

Luau: Joan announced that Country Club lanes has invited us to have our luau there, free of charge. They have stated that they will close the entire facility down to the public on that evening for this event. C.B. met with Tony to go over the proposed seating chart, since Joan was uncertain if the facility could hold everyone that shows up. As it looks right now, we would have 2 dance floors set up....one in the lounge and one on the tiled area where the pool tables are currently set up. They would also set up a second cash bar at the snack bar which would reduce the crowd at the main bar. The pool tables will be removed, along with many of the tables and ball holders along the front desk area. Draping will be put up to block the view of the lanes and we should be able to seat approximately 500 people in all of the areas combined, per the charts provided. We might need to rent some extra tables and chairs, but beyond decorations, DJs and the food, we would not incur any other expense (facility fees, insurance, bartenders, etc.). We would have to add one more DJ for the second dance floor. It was discussed that the Christmas party went so well and this would be a wonderful opportunity. Joan asked for a motion to accept this invitation. Lee Neese made a motion to accept the invitation and Kim Sellars seconded it. All approved.

By-laws Review Committee: Joan asked for volunteers of those wanting to be on the committee. She will then appoint a committee and committee chairperson from that listing. Those who volunteered were: Mike Wilson, Sissy Tillman, Lorna Shively, Dianne Neese, Lee Neese, Amy Crawford, Edith Loy, Kurt Lankford, Baxter Sellars, Janice McSherry and Evelyn Turner.

Membership Appreciation Party: The date and type of party has not been determined as of yet, but per Joan, the officers will be planning a party for the membership appreciation this year.

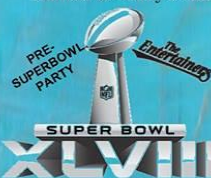

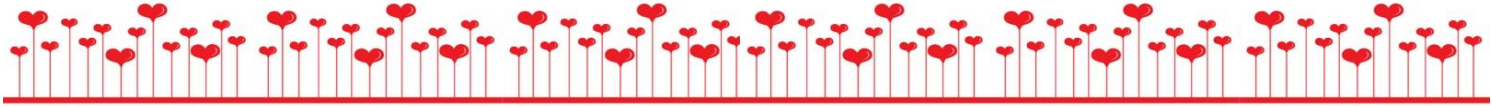
