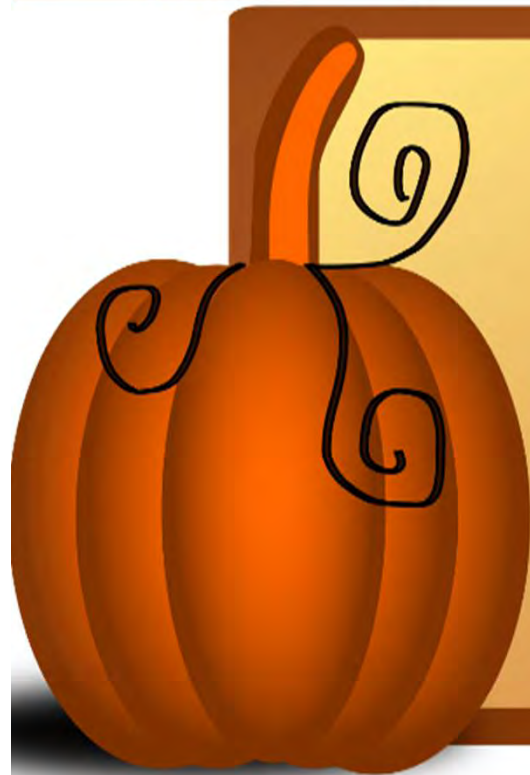

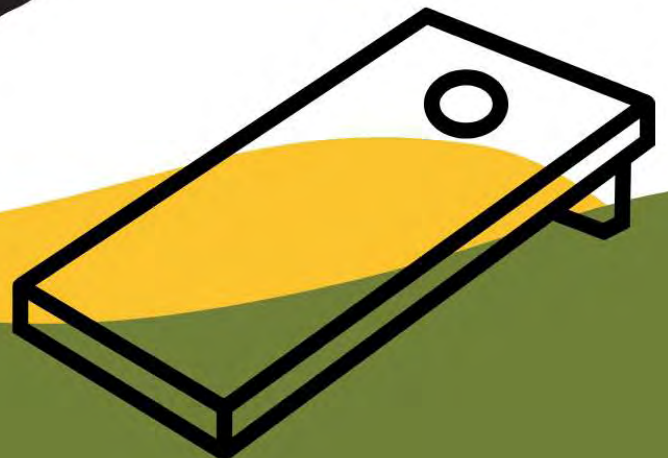

## What is Beach Music, Again

Editors note...this one is worth reading twice!

Over the years many articles have attempted to define Beach Music—is it important to ask "What is Beach Music" again?

Yes...For two reasons.

Beach Music continues to change...as does the Shag. In my short 19 years of involvement I've seen dramatic changes in the scope of the music and the execution of the dance.

There was a time in the early 80's when college Boppers performed a Shag modified with "pretzel" movements borrowed from 1930's Arthur Murray-style jitterbug, while right next to them on the dance floor were contest dancers following the trajectory to today's nearly endless pirouettes.

Alongside these dancers were 50's and 60's "purists" out to maintain the more unstructured shuffling and diggin' they enjoyed at the beaches and pavilions in their heydays. Who's right? Everyone!

Is Beach Music changin'?.....it always has been. Human beings do not tape a sitcom and watch it 12,000 times for the rest of their lives. We don't wear the same clothes, fix our hair the same, apply the same makeup or even the same fingernail polish. We're always evolving and at the same time attempting to conserve that which we love. We are at once conservative and liberal.

Given that Beach Music and Shag have always been changing what is it we attempt to conserve?

In the December 29, 1994 issue of *Rolling Stone*, Mark Coleman, in a column reviewing new books on music, stated, "By nature, rock remains an elusive subject—it's difficult to nail down in words, especially at book length. But the best entries in this messy genre crackle with the same irreverent energy and insightful flashes as the music itself." Rock is officially 40 years old next year, but the pre-eminent voice of rock still cannot nail it down. Beach Music is far older, but does it crackle with irreverent energy, insightful flashes, and spawn innumerable books? Is it worth nailing down, or is it something else?

In the same issue of *Rolling Stone*, Jann Wenner, the visionary with passion and perseverance, despite the pundits and doomsayers of the day, who helped set its course in 1967, mused in an open letter to the magazine's readers, "Times like these can sharpen our focus and help bring new energy to our mission: to offer our readers strong voices and clear vision—a way to see the world through the prism of rock and roll."

Bringing us to reason #2 for our original question: "What is the prism of Beach and Shag Music through which we see the world?"

Do Country music devotees see the world differently than classical music fans? Does the Rap music generation see the world differently than Beachdiggers?

So, what is Beach Music?

A musician might say that every kind of music is played in a certain style, satisfying a question about the mechanics of reproduction, but not what it *is*.

A performer might answer in the context of singing with it; from "I just like to sing," to "I just try to honestly express my feelings with the music."

An anthropologist would look for its utilitarian uses. Is it only for religious rituals? Important community events like the marriage of a chieftain, gathering the harvest, celebrating the solstice?

Physicists might answer in terms of sound vibrations per second.

A historian might point out that there was a time when music and voice were one, as with the very early Greeks. They didn't have separate words for music and lyric because they were one. Their word for communication was a synergy of music and voice. One could not even think of writing or speaking in ancient Greece without the simultaneous production of music-and-voice. It was centuries before they were ever divided. A Greek listening to symphonic music or human conversation today might suffer severe stress from observing what was missing in each!

Even a cursory examination of what the masters—composers, performers, songwriters, arrangers, conductors—describe music to be will soon produce confusion; they don't agree.

All these people could be talking about the same music, viewed through different prisms! A prism, then, is an "understanding"; a worldview; a philosophy. It's *not* the music.

We can talk around the question further by saying that each of these styles of music is something we choose because of the culture we grow up in (although many who choose did not grow up in the culture).

Our question seeks a different answer: What is it that is being chosen? If we all observed the same thing, then we would have the same answer when we describe music. But we don't. Thus, I assume we don't have similar criteria and language for observing it. Perhaps the people I enumerated above are on the right track—their explanations don't describe music, but they do reveal their criteria for looking at it.

Some say they love Beach and Shag Music because of the camaraderie. Yet, there's camaraderie in Rock 'n Roll, Country and the rest. Others say they love the sharing; the steps we all perform. Still others just want to share the experience. For them my quest for understanding is irritating at best.

This, column, then is for those who are willing to walk a little ways with me on my quest. When I look at Beach Music and the Shag, I see carefreeness. Obvious? Not really! Try being carefree when you're stressed out. If you can then you're an *Edge Dancer* with a huge capacity to "dance" with others in life.

If you can only be carefree when you're re-creating; then you're still lucky. Many folks are either "workaholics" or "veg" out at night and on weekends. Or, they go home and find "leisure" activities to work and work and work at. Many people find that making friends or just "having fun" with others is hard work. They either don't choose to Shag or they choose it as a new practice to break the habits of loneliness, but it's not easy at first. Carefreeness is not in the Shag, though, or the music; it's in the person. Ever see someone who tried to do it and gave up because it was too hard? Or they were scared? One has to be carefree, or willing to put aside one's misgivings to learn to be carefree, in order to take up the dance and the music. Carefreeness is in the culture that surrounds the Shag, not in the dance itself. If one finds the Shag difficult, but wants to be carefree, then it's mingling with the people who do it that produces carefreeness—not the steps. Doing the steps over and over can produce confidence in executing the moves, but that isn't carefreeness either. Jo Jo Putnam puts the carefreeness into the Shag. Not the other way around.

Oddly, another closely-connected aspect is 'Caring.' (Can 'caring' and 'carefreeness' exist simultaneously in the same space? Certainly! There's a technical term for it in magic; it's called a *paradox*.)

'Caring' shows up in the stories of the Hall of Famers and others from the 40s, 50s and 60s eras who describe the way in which they took care of one another at the beach; especially those with summer-long resort jobs. A close examination of the Shag itself reveals 'caring' as well.

Watch the couples who are moving together, smiling at one another and having fun. Although the man may be leading most of the time, if he **cares** for his partner, he's leading her where she wants to go. And they're both loving the synchronicity and sharing.

Another aspect of the Shag/Beach culture is that it constantly pushes against the social envelope. Because it's not mainstream—part of the pop culture (whether rock, country or otherwise)—it requires a willingness to be outside the national drift. Why? What's in the Shag culture that isn't found in Rock, Country or Rap?

One of the features I find fulfilling is how the culture promotes gentlemanly and ladylike behavior; a legacy given us by folks from generations of unselfconscious gentility. (Otherwise how could thousands of folks show up at S.O.S. year after year without the usually attendant ambulances and police that circle other similarly-sized festivities?)

Does this give a clue yet to why there are so many joining S.O.S., Shag Clubs and Bop Clubs throughout the country? When someone not in the culture looks at a Shagger and decides to join in, it's not because they can do the 'steps' and it's not because of the music. The same music makes many people miserable. In fact, none of us like all of the Shag Music. Many of us intensely dislike some of the Shag Music genre (cowboy Shag, disco Shag, jump blues, etc.).

Rather than camaraderie, it's the mutual respect and caring that attend the camaraderie. The Beach Music sub-culture = carefreeness, caring, mutual respect and 'pushing the envelope' (i.e. improvisation). A sub-culture is always an improvisation at the edge of a larger culture in the same way the shaman conjures in the darkness. The shaman is dedicated to the tribe's social well-being and dances his magic all night in the forest's shadow at the periphery of the village.

According to the late twentieth century Canadian philosopher, Marshall McLuhan, a culture's games always provide whatever is missing in the society at large. For many men, glued to football, basketball and baseball games on the weekends, it is the camaraderie of their fellow males, playing together and growing together, passing through clearly delineated rites of manhood, into greater roles in society that is missing.

For those of us in the Rhythm 'n Beach Network it is a clearly delineated understanding of Beach Music and the Shag woven into the many strands of S.O.S., S.P.A., Association of Carolina Shag Clubs, Association of Beach and Shag Club Dee Jays, radio stations, record companies, and fans everywhere, who see the future through the prism of Beach Music, dancing in its scintillating lights.

*(The Rhythm 'n Beach Network is John Hook and Chris Beachley, with the talented partnership of Randy Rowland and many others, providing three syndicated radio shows: The Rhythm 'n Beach Top 40 Countdown, Rhythm 'n Beach Classics, the Rhythm 'n Beach Fish Fry along with the Rhythm 'n Beach Newsletter.
